The Hospital Infections Program (HIP), National Center for Infectious Diseases, Centers for Disease Control (CDC), is recruiting for a Deputy Chief, **Investigation and Prevention** Branch. Ongoing branch activities include multicenter studies of risk factors and predictors of anaphylactic reactions in patients and healthcare workers, analysis of the CDC-Healthcare Financing Administration survey of US dialysis centers; evaluation of risk factors for nosocomial infections in neonatal and adult intensive care units, for invasive candidiasis in immunocompromised patients, and for Pseudomonas cepacia in cystic fibrosis patients: evaluation of the role of cytokines in the pathogenesis of pyrogenic reactions in hemodialysis patients and as predictors of sepsis in neonates; and evaluation of the epidemiological utility of typing systems for bacteria and fungi.

The incumbent will share fully in responsibility for supervising outbreak investigations and epidemiological studies. In addition, the incumbent will be responsible for designing, conducting, analyzing, and publishing epidemiologic studies on risk factors for infection in immunocompromised (including intensive care unit) patients. In cooperation with other CDC components, the Deputy Chief will provide leadership related to the surveillance and prevention of nosocomial infections and complications associated with healthcare; provide direction and technical expertise in the design and overseeing of surveillance

systems development; supervise the planning, development, distribution, and evaluation of guidelines and recommendations for the prevention of nosocomial infections; and provide leadership and expert consultations on issues related to the surveillance, prevention, and control of nosocomial infections and noninfectious complications associated with healthcare to state and local health departments, national and international public health and government organizations, healthcare facilities, and professional organizations.

A doctor of medicine degree is required. EIS or comparable epidemiologic training/experience and extensive experience in the conduct and supervision of hospital outbreaks and the conduct of national and international epidemiologic studies of nosocomial infections are preferred. Experience and proficiency in writing, public speaking, and the use of micro and mainframe computers are highly desirable. Some domestic and international travel will be required.

Call for Nominations

Program

The programs will be held September 17-20 in Atlanta, Georgia, and November 19-22 in Salt Lake City, Utah. Donald A. Goldmann, MD, William Martone, MD, John P. Burke, MD, and Gina Pugliese, RN, MS, will co-chair the program. Enrollment in the programs is limited to 120.

Purpose

These programs, developed by the Society for Hospital Epidemiology of **America** (SHEA), the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), and the American Hospital Association (AHA), are intended for infectious disease fellows and new hospital epidemiologists. They emphasize hands-on exercises in which participants work in small groups to detect, investigate, and control epidemiological problems encountered in the hospital setting. These work sessions are supplemented with lectures and seminars covering fundamental aspects of hospital epidemiology including epidemiology and surveillance, epidemic investigation, transmission and control of **nosocomial** infections, disinfection and sterilization, employee health, isolation systems, regulatory compliance, and quality improvement.

Awards

Scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 will be awarded to **five** infectious disease fellows for each program to defray the special course fee for fellows of \$350 and expenses incurred in **attending** the training program.

Interested fellows must submit a letter of no more than one page describing why they would like to have additional training in hospital epidemiology. A letter from the fellow's program director outlining the applicant's **qualifications** and suitability for the course also is required. Scholarship applications for the September course in Atlanta are already closed. The deadline for receipt of applications for the November 1992 **course** is **Friday, September 19, 1992.**

The **SHEA** Educational Activities Committee will select the scholarship recipients based on review of these letters. Winners will be notified in mid-October 1992.
