## Council Minutes August 31, 1988

Editor's Note: These minutes are subject to the approval of the Council at its April 7, 1989 meeting in Washington, D.C.

The Council of the American Political Science Association met at 9:30 a.m. on August 31, 1988 in Washington, D.C. at the Washington
