PAUL OSKAR KRISTELLER, a founder and former President of the RSA (1957–1958) and presently member of the Executive Board, has been awarded a John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation fellowship in the amount of \$300,000 to pursue his scholarly work over the next five years. Professor Kristeller is F.J.E. Woodbridge Professor Emeritus of Philosophy at Columbia University.
