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Shoplifting

Shoplifting is common. The Centre for Retail Research estimates that customer and staff theft in the UK accounted for nearly £4000 million in 2011 alone. Generally there is no link with mental disorder. But it can be associated with depression, often in apparently well-adjusted, law-abiding women, in middle or later life and what appears to be a conventional marriage.
