
IXTH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF AUDIOLOGY

The next (IX) International Congress of Audiology will be held at the Royal College of Surgeons in London from 15–19 September 1968. The President of the Congress will be Air Vice-Marshal E. D. D. Dickson, C.B., C.B.E.

The morning of 16 September will be devoted to a session on the SURGERY OF DEAFNESS under the chairmanship of the President of the British Association of Otolaryngologists. On each of the three subsequent mornings, there will be a round table conference. These three round table conferences will be:

- I. THE PSYCHO-PHYSIOLOGICAL MATURATION OF THE AUDITORY SENSATION (Moderator: P. Mounier-Kuhn).
- II. PRESBYACUSIS (Moderator: H. A. E. van Dishoeck).
- III. SOCIAL ADJUSTMENT OF DEAF SCHOOL LEAVERS (Moderator: M. Reed).

The afternoons will be devoted to contributed papers and discussions. Those who wish to have a paper considered for presentation at the Congress should send a 600 word summary, which should be factual and not merely topical, to the Secretary-General, Dr. R. Hinchcliffe, 330, Gray's Inn Road, London, W.C.I, as soon as possible. A special Committee will make a selection of contributed communications for the scientific programme.
