WORLD CONGRESS ON BEHAVIOUR THERAPY

The first World Congress on Behaviour Therapy will be held July 13-17, 1980 in Jerusalem under the auspices of the American and European Associations for Behaviour Therapy (AABT, EABT) and in close co-operation with Behaviour Therapy Associations in other parts of the world. The Tenth Annual Conference of the European Association of Behaviour Therapy will be an integral part of the Congress.

The Congress plan represents an unprecedented attempt to integrate world work in behaviour therapy and related disciplines under the general theme: *Behaviour-Therapy contributions to person and society*. Discourse, practice, and informal meetings are planned for in the form of invited addresses, symposia, poster sessions, pre- and postcongress workshops and conversation-contact hours.

Researchers and practitioners in behaviour therapy and related disciplines are invited to submit a proposed symposium, paper or workshop for consideration by the Scientific Program Committee. Individual or symposium papers should represent original contributions and be substantially different from papers published or represented by the authors elsewhere.
