The frequent occurrence during recent years of sprue amongst the planting community of Ceylon, together with the lack of trustworthy information on the subject, made it advisable, from an economic, as well as from a humanitarian point of view, that the subject should be investigated in the light of modern research. At the request of the government of Ceylon, therefore, the London School of Tropical Medicine appointed Dr Bahr to undertake such an investigation and in these pages he has recorded the results of his efforts to unravel the etiology of one of the least understood, but nevertheless one of the most insidious diseases known to Tropical Medicine.
