JUBILEE MEMOIR OF THE EUGENICS SOCIETY

To celebrate the seventy-fifth anniversary of the founding of the Eugenics Society, Mrs Dorothy Middleton, greatniece of Sir Francis Galton, was invited to give an address at a Reception held in September 1982. She chose as her topic 'Some Memories of Francis Galton', interweaving into details known from his formal biographies many others still hidden away in private family papers. She revised and expanded her text, which the Eugenics Society has now published as a Jubilee Memoir. Dorothy Middleton's power of descriptive writing, and her understanding of and sympathy with the personality of Sir Francis, have combined to make this an enthralling vignette of the life of a true scientist.
