# **David Wiggins**

Wykeham Professor of Logic in the University of Oxford. He was previously Professor of Philosophy at Birkbeck College, London. He has written Sameness & Substance, and Needs, Values Truth.

# Theodore Redpath

Dr Redpath died earlier this year at the age of 83. He read English at Cambridge in the 1930s and went on to do a Ph.D. on Leibniz under C. D. Broad. In 1950 he became a Fellow of Trinity College, Cambridge and for many years served as a University Lecturer in English. His interests ranged widely from Greek tragedy and theories of tragedy to topics in aesthetics and the history of philosophy. His published work included books on *Tolstoy* (1960) and *Wittgenstein: A Student's Memoir* (1990), editions of Donne's *Songs and Sonnets* (1956; revised 1983) and Shakespeare's *Sonnets* (1964), and numerous articles on Bacon, Tennyson, Locke, Wittgenstein and Moore.
