## **Ermanno Pitacco (1947–2022)**

On September 23, 2022, Ermanno Pitacco passed away. The announcement on the obituary reads "Venerdì 23 settembre, in punta di piedi, se ne è andato Ermanno Pitacco per raggiungere la sua amata Carla" ... these words were still written by Ermanno himself.
