What is a Fair International Society?

International Law Between Development and Recognition

Emmanuelle Tourme-Jouannet

Today's world is post-colonial and post-Cold War. These twin characteristics explain why international society is also riddled by the two major forms of injustice which Nancy Fraser identified as afflicting national societies. First, the economic and social disparities between states caused outcry in the 1950s when the first steps were taken towards decolonisation. Second, international society is increasingly confronted with culture- and identityrelated claims, stretching the dividing line between equality and difference. In answer to these two forms of claim, the subjects of international society have come up with two types of remedy encapsulated in legal rules: the law of development and the law of recognition, the first milestones towards what might become a fairer international society.
