





Breeding Endangered Species in Captivity

This book is the result of the first international conference on the planned breeding of endangered species in captivity. Held in Jersey, in May 1972. It was sponsored by the Fauna Preservation Society and the Jersey Wildlife Preservation Trust. The papers in this collection have been extensively re-edited and rewritten in the interim period.

According to Sir Peter Scott, man has increased the rate of extinction of species by a factor of four over the last two hundred years. In order to redress the balance we must look to zoos, not merely as places of captivity, "stationary circuses", but as "wildlife banks" acting as breeding centres with a view to returning captively bred endangered species to their natural habitats. If such reservoirs are to become more numerous, exchanges, loans and donations between zoos and related bodies are needed on a greater scale, and the zoo must realise its function as an educational source for the public as well as the specialist. While this is the main theme of the book, other papers focus on the recent advances made in captive breeding, on the necessity of maintaining the natural habitat, and on a wide range of vertebrate animals.
