



The epic of Jeki la Njambè has been performed among the Duala and related peoples of the Cameroon coast since at least the mid-nineteenth century and recorded in several indigenous, French and German texts in more recent times. The Elusive Epic contains English translations in whole or part of ten different versions of Jeki ranging from virtuoso performances with back-up troupes through family storytellers to Negritude poetry and contemporary pop music. The first half of the book discusses the epic as both a cultural and historical artifact although neither the contents nor local understandings of the epic link Jeki la Njambè to the very well known regional history of Atlantic commerce and Duala hegemony.
