

This book concerns one of the six main themes of the Stockholm Conference, namely The Planning and Managing of Human Settlements for Environment Quality. It analyses the nature of the problems arising in this field from conflicts between manmade and natural environments and from conflicts between man's activities within human settlements. It goes on to show that a comprehensive planning system is essential to the solution of these problems, to describe the machinery required for the making and implementation of comprehensive plans. and to indicate how developing countries can avoid, by timely preventive action, the mistakes of the past which now compel developed countries to adopt expensive remedies. It concludes by setting out the recommendations for policy and action approved by the United Nations General Assembly as a result of the Conference.


