

The Review of Socialist Law covers all areas of the legal systems in Eastern Europe, China, and other Socialist states. As the Soviet legal model has spread beyond Eastern Europe diversification has meant that the specifically Soviet flavour of many legal institutions has been lost or attenuated. What has usually remained is three elements of political life which have a decisive impact on the structure of the legal systems of the countries concerned: the paramount position of a single leading party, large-scale Marxist-inspired nationalization or socialization of the means of production, and rigid economic planning.
