Jonathan writes: 'Having been admitted to the Bethlem hospital I grabbed the chance at the Bethlem pottery to try figurative sculpture. Over the years admissions, since, of unstable accommodation, occasional spells of formal art education etc., the body of my work is the one thread of progress. I have used it as a way of investigating self-perception, other see me and how I perceive others. Only by using myself as a model was I able to accept how distorted my view of myself was, and only when my consultant was advised



to see my work, was it realised how far from reality I really was. Without that recognition, I wouldn't be alive today.

'Using myself as a model can involve hours before the mirror. On a break, and trying to think of a confrontationally effeminate pose, I saw myself with cigarette in hand. Smoking is a habit I picked up in my first time in hospital, and which I use to self-medicate to this day'.
