## CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

J. W. Daly is Associate Professor of History at McMaster University, and specializes in seventeenth-century English political thought. He also writes on conservative political thought and has published a volume of educational criticism, Education or Molasses?: A Critical Look at the Hall-Dennis Report on Education.

Gertrude Himmelfarb is Professor of History at Brooklyn College of the City University of New York and the author of Victorian Minds, of Darwin and the Darwinian Revolution and of Lord Acton: A Study in Conscience and Politics.

Henry Horwitz is Professor of History at the University of Iowa, and is the author of *Revolution Politicks: The Career of Daniel Finch, Second Earl of Nottingham*, 1647-1730.

Ira Klein is Assistant Professor of History at The American University. He has published several articles on British diplomacy in Asia, and on modern Indian social and economic history in the *Economic History Review*, the *Historical Journal*, and other journals.

Bruce A. Knox is Lecturer in History at Monash University. His research at present concerns the life and work of the fourth Earl of Carnarvon, and the entire question of British colonial policy in the mid-Victorian period. He has written a number of articles.

Roger B. Manning is Associate Professor in the Department of History at the Cleveland State University. He has published many articles in church history, as well as a book, *Religion and Society in Elizabethan Sussex*. He is currently at work on a study of "The Exercise of the Royal Ecclesiastical Supremacy under the Tudors."

Lois G. Schwoerer is Associate Professor of History at the George Washington University. She has published several other articles on English history which appeared in the Huntington Library Quarterly and The Historian as well as the Journal of British Studies.

Carl H. E. Zangerl is a Teaching Assistant in the Department of History, at the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana. He is presently examining political party inter-action and liberal-socialist cooperation in the Grand Duchy of Baden between 1905 and 1913. This is his first published article.
