Place-names used in *Polar Record* are those authorized by the administrative authority of each area as recognized by the British Government. Names not yet so authorized are avoided, where possible, or placed in quotation marks. Russian names are transliterated by the system agreed in 1947 between the United States Board on Geographic Names and the Permanent Committee on Geographical Names for British Official Use (see *Polar Record*, Vol 6, No 44, 1952, p 546).
