

## NOTICE TO AUTHORS

*Latin American Antiquity* publishes original papers on the archaeology, prehistory, and ethnohistory of Latin America, i.e., Mesoamerica, Central America, and South America, together with culturally affiliated adjacent regions. Papers may also treat more general theoretical and methodological issues with relevance to Latin America. Authors submit manuscripts to the editor for consideration as ARTICLES or REPORTS in English, Spanish, or Portuguese. The normal, expected length of an ARTICLE will be 10–15,000 words, including bibliographies and tables. REPORTS should be under 10,000 words. Tables and illustrations should be limited to those that are appropriate and necessary. Authors are required to submit manuscripts electronically through Editorial Manager® (<http://www.editorialmanager.com/laq>). Detailed information on policy, style, and technical matters of manuscript preparation is given in English and in Spanish in the “Editorial Policy, Information for Authors, and Style Guide for *American Antiquity* and *Latin American Antiquity*,” available through the World Wide Web at <http://www.saa.org/Publications/StyleGuide/styframe.html>.
