To all European psychiatrists,

The exchange of knowledge and experience among the more than 50,000 psychiatrists working in Europe in a variety of health care systems provides great potential for the growth and development of European psychiatry. The AEP (Association of European Psychiatrists) is the largest international organisation of psychiatrists in Europe, working with the objective of stimulating and integrating educational, scientific and policy activities in the whole domain of psychiatry within a European framework.

Come and participate in further developing the identity and tradition of European Psychiatry and in creating networks for action in the field of psychiatry.

An exciting cultural programme will complement the endeavours in science. By joining various components of this programme or by exploring on your own, you will also be able to enjoy the charm and the Nobel spirit of Stockholm.
