#### NOTICE

There has recently been published a Dictionary of Philosophy under the editorship of Dagobert D. Runes. In advance announcements of the Dictionary the names of the undersigned appeared in the lists of Associate and Contributing Editors. We objected to the publication of the work in its present form, and some of us made vigorous efforts to persuade Mr. Runes to delay publication until it had been very materially revised. These efforts were to no avail, and the work appeared with full editorial responsibility being assumed by Mr. Runes. It remains, however, a matter of professional embarrassment to us that our names were used in the advance publicity obtained for this work, and we therefore feel obliged to make a public disavowal of any editorial responsibility for it. We desire also to make it clear that we cannot always accept responsibility for our individually signed articles, since in some cases changes have been made without the approval of the author concerned.
