CALL FOR PAPERS: Northeastern Journal of Agricultural and Resource Economics

THEME: The Changing Composition of the Agricultural Industry

The Northeastern Journal of Agricultural and Resource Economics will publish papers on the theme "The Changing Composition of the Agricultural Industry" as a special section of its Spring 1992 issue. In the papers, authors are expected to review and discuss current knowledge, issues, research needs, and appropriate research methods. Papers will be subject to review. There will be page charges on published articles. These papers are not expected to be research reports, which should be submitted as regular Journal articles.

Authors might address the changes in farm and agribusiness size, location, distribution, and choice of activities, and the factors responsible for the changes (such as urban growth, policy, and technological change). Pressures encouraging change in production and markets originating from within and outside a region can be discussed (such as the degree of competitiveness). Papers relating environmental and resource economics issues to the composition of agriculture are also encouraged.

GUIDELINES FOR MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION

ELIGIBILITY: At least one author must be a member of the NAREA.

SUBMISSION: Three copies of the manuscript should be submitted.

TITLE PAGE AND ABSTRACT: On a separate page list the title of the paper, the authors, their titles and affiliations, and an abstract not to exceed 100 words. The title will be repeated on the first page of the manuscript but not the authors' names.

TYPING: The manuscript should be typed on $8\frac{1}{2}$ " × 11" standard weight paper and all material, including references and footnotes, should be double-spaced.

TABLES: Each table should be on a separate page. Titles should be short and descriptive.

FIGURES: Prepare on heavy white paper using india ink or other materials suitable for photographic reproduction. Most will be reduced so typescript should be avoided. MATHEMATICAL NOTATION: Use only essential

notation and use standard type to the extent possible.

FOOTNOTES: In general, the use of footnotes should be avoided. Number them consecutively and type double-spaced on separate pages at the end of the manuscript. REFERENCES: List references alphabetically and unnumbered on a separate page or pages at the end of the manuscript with the heading "References." Use the same format for references as is used in previous issues of this *Journal*. List only those actually cited. Refer to references by the names of the authors. Cite the year of the publication if an author has more than one reference cited. If there is more than one in a given year then use, for example, 1981a, 1981b. Authors can be referred to in the text parenthetically as (Smith) or (Jones 1981) or (Smith, p. 5), or the names can be used as part of a sentence such as "Smith and Jones maintain..."

REVIEW: All manuscripts submitted will be referred by the editorial board and others selected for their professional competence.

PAGE CHARGE: A page charge is billed to the department or agency after the article is accepted for publication.
