VACCINES

For Prophylaxis against Respiratory Infections.

THE micro-organisms most commonly found in patients suffering from "colds" are Pneumococcus, Pfeiffer's Bacillus, Micrococcus catarrhalis and Bacillus septus; and these are included in the Anti-Catarrhalis Vaccine prepared in the Department for Therapeutic Inoculation, St Mary's Hospital, W.2, specially for the prophylaxis of colds in adults.
