IPSA 1979 World Congress Visa Non-Discrimination Policy

The Executive Committee of the International Political Science Association has published a visa non-discrimination policy for the 1979 World Congress to be held in the Soviet Union in the recent issue of its newsletter, *Participation.* The statement is as follows:

The Executive Committee of the IPSA accepts assurances by the Chairman of the Soviet Organization Committee that there will be no discrimination in the issuing of visas. It recognizes that certain technical problems may arise. Participants in the Congress will be instructed to request their visas at least three months prior to the Congress. The Soviet authorities will be asked to inform applicants about the visa decision at the latest one month prior to the Congress (by July 12th, 1979) and, if possible, to indicate reasons should there be a refusal. In case of failure to obtain a visa, participants are advised to contact the Secretary-General of the IPSA one month prior to the Congress. The President and Secretary-General of IPSA will then enter into discussion with the Soviet Organization Committee and the Soviet authorities.

Regional and State Political Science Associations

At the 1977 Annual Meeting of the Association, officers of the state and regional associations again met. The meeting provided officers an opportunity to discuss mutual concerns in conducting state and regional associations as well as ways in which the organizations can be strengthened.
