The Society was entertained to a civic reception by the Lord Mayor of Amsterdam in the Rijksmuseum on Tuesday, 24 August, and to an academic reception by the Rectores Magnifici of the University of Amsterdam, the Free University of Amsterdam and the University of Leiden at Leiden on Thursday, 26 August. On 27 August a number of members took part in an enjoyable excursion to the cities of Delft, Schoonhoven and Gouda.

The Society's 27th General Meeting will be held at the Claremont Colleges, California from 28 August to 1 September 1972. This meeting will be followed immediately by the Congress of Learned Societies in the Field of Religion which is planned to take place in Los Angeles from 1 to 6 September. Through the generosity of various bodies in America, substantial financial help is being given to members from Europe to enable them to attend the meetings. R. S. BARBOUR
