WOLF BLEEK lectures in cultural anthropology at the University of Amsterdam. He has done fieldwork in Kwahu, Ghana and has published articles on marriage and (matrilineal) kinship, on witchcraft and on birth control practices.

MAIA GREEN is engaged in research on contemporary Catholicism in southern Tanzania, for her PhD in social anthropology at the London School of Economics. Her interest is the widespread church-sponsored initiatives in rural development.

MARGARET HALL read anthropology at University College London and Africa Area Studies at the School of Oriental and African Studies, London. For the past fifteen years she has been engaged in research on Africa (including more than ten years on Mozambique).

NANCY LAWLER is Professor of Economics and History at Oakton Community College, Illinois, and is a Visiting Scholar at Northwestern University. Between 1985 and 1987, she worked with veterans in the Côte d'Ivoire; her doctoral thesis is a study of the impact of the Second World War upon that country.

C. ONYEKA NWANUNOBI is a senior lecturer in the Department of Sociology/ Anthropology at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka. Trained in History (BA, MA) and Anthropology (PhD, Toronto), he has also taught at Erindale College, University of Toronto.

PAMELA REYNOLDS directs the Childhood Action, Research and Documentation Institute in Harare. She has been working most recently on the economic contribution of Tonga children in the Zambezi valley. Her publications include Childhood in Crossroads: cognition and society in South Africa (Cape Town: D. Philip, 1989) and Growing up in a Divided Society: the contexts of childhood in South Africa which she edited with Sandra Burman (Johannesburg: Ravan Press, 1986).

W. E. F. WARD is best known for the many editions of his 1939 classic *History of the Gold Coast/Ghana*, but the range of his writing is wide, and includes a handbook on music and editions of Bowditch's and Dupuis's journals.
