SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS.

- Mr. J. P. T. Burchell, F.S.A., showed flints from the Cannon-shot gravels of Lincolnshire from the 100 foot terrace underlying Brown Boulder Clay, and from the 50 foot terrace, also under Brown Boulder Clay.
- Mr. E. H. Rogers and Mr. Reid Moir exhibited two Rostro-carinate implements from the basal deposit below the Coomer Forest Bed.
 - Mr. F. H. Worsfold exhibited flint blades and bone tools from the Swalecliffe brickearths, Kent.
 - Mr. E. H. N. Shrimshire exhibited flints and sherds from under alluvium at Walton-on-the-Naze.
 - Canon A. Hunt showed microliths from North Lincolnshire.
 - Dr. R. V. Favell, F.S.A., exhibited pottery from Lowland Point, S. Cornwall.

OBITUARY.

PROFESSOR J. E. MARR, F.R.S.

Our Society has suffered a grievous loss in the death of one of its most distinguished members, Professor J. E. Marr, F.R.s. He was 76 at the time of his death, and, during his long life, had devoted himself, with brilliant success, to the study of Geology. As is well known, Marr's chief contributions to geological knowledge related to the oldest fossiliferous rocks so richly developed in the Lake District, near to which he was born and which he never ceased In 1917 he was elected Woodwardian Professor of Geology in the University of Cambridge, and held, with distinction, this important position till his retirement in 1930. It was in the year 1909 that I first became acquainted with Marr, and afterwards enjoyed the privilege of his friendship. He had at that time, begun to take an active and enlightening interest in the Pleistocene deposits of Cambridge and the adjoining areas, and had entered upon the highly complex task of the correlation of these beds with the glacial epochs, and flint implements of this region. I am able to speak with first-hand knowledge of the value of Marr's researches and teaching, and of the great debt which those who interest themselves in prehistoric archaeology owe to him. In 1920, he was elected President of our Society and his address, "Man and the Ice Age," may be said to represent the first exposition, by an eminent geologist, of the new geological and archaeological facts which had come to light in the researches then being undertaken in East Anglia. Marr had previously published a paper in our *Proceedings* on 'A Late Palaeolithic Site on Wortham Heath, near Thetford,' and took a leading part in the excavations carried out at High Lodge, Mildenhall, in 1920. The last paper from his pen, published by our Society was entitled "An implement from Higham, Suffolk.

The soundness of Marr's geological work, combined with a fearless expression of opinion and an abounding kindness to all with whom he was associated, won for him our respect and affection. By his death the scientific world has lost a great and human personality.
