This comparative analysis of British and German left-wing movements during the First World War is based almost entirely on new sources. Carsten brings to light many similarities between the radical movements in both countries—the British Independent Labour Party and the German Independent Social Democratic Party. Their attitude—that this was the imperialists' war, not their own—was echoed in the shop steward's movements in both countries, and in the many strikes on both sides that threatened the production of armaments.


