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SHEA National Meeting a Hit

Our first official, national scientific meeting, "Hospital Epidemiology: New Challenges and Controversies," was held March 10-12 in Baltimore. The meeting, cosponsored by SHEA and the *Journal*, was a resounding educational and scientific success. Clearly, two "thumbs up" were accorded by the delighted audience.

Meeting attendance topped the 300 mark, with participants coming from as far away as the United Kingdom, India, and Japan. Despite the balmy early spring weather and the sightseeingpacked venue of Baltimore's charming Inner Harbor area, our meeting hall was full for every sessionup through the final presentations Sunday morning. Such a level of interest in a scientific meeting is probably unparalleled in recent history.

The 30-person faculty provided information, data, and opinions that were virtually up-to-the-minute. The postpresentation question-and-answer sessions were especially lively, and the extremely well-informed audience members never seemed to tire of collegially quizzing the speakers and sharing their own insights and new information.

The Poster Session included 22 abstracts and posters, which were well displayed and heavily viewed.

The triumphant Program Committee (Ms. Bolyard and Drs. Garibaldi, Hierholzer, Schaffner, Townsend, and Wenzel) and the session chairmen plan to publish a summary of the meeting's scientific sessions in the *Journal* later this year.

The National Meeting Evaluation Committee (Drs. Schaberg, Mayhall, Garibaldi, and Townsend) will be evaluating the written comments of the meeting attendees and will make recommendations regarding subsequent national scientific offerings by the Society.

Nosocomial Sessions at Upcoming ASM Meetings

Division L (Nosocomial Infections) of the American Society for Microbiology (ASM) has an active agenda planned for the annual ASM meeting, May 14-18, 1989, in New Orleans. The outgoing Division L chairman, David Shlaes, MD, and the 1989 chairman, Glen Mayhall, MD, encourage their SHEA colleagues to attend this excellent and exciting meeting.

Division L will sponsor six seminars, two poster sessions, and one slide session. The seminars are: 1) Clostridium difficile Infections: New Lessons from Bacterial Typing Systems; 2) Computerized Infoimation Systems and Hospital Epidemiology; 3) Current Concepts in Biosafety; 4) Rapidly Growing Non-Tuberculous Mycobacteria: 5) Surgical Wound Infection Update: Epidemiology, Pathogenesis, and Prevention; and 6) Antibiotic Resistance. There will be a slide presentation on "Molecular Markers for Hospital-Acquired Microorganisms," and poster sessions on "Hospital Outbreaks of Nosocomial Pathogens" and "Surveillance, Cost, and Prevention of Nosocomial Infections." The Division L speaker will be Richard Wenzel, MD, who will present "New Frontiers for Hospital Epidemiology: Assuring Quality Care."
