Side-scan sonar image of the wreck of one of Sir John Franklin's ships sitting on the seabed near Hat Island in southeastern Queen Maud Gulf. It was obtained in early September 2014 by a towfish towed by the dive-boat *Investigator*, based on the Canadian Coastguard's icebreaker CCGS *Sir Wilfrid Laurier* which was a major player in the Victoria Strait expedition in its search for the missing ships, HMS *Erebus* and *Terror*.
