Details of Whitehaven Practitioners

AIREY, Lancelot, M.D., Leiden. Thesis 'De Gonorrhoea Virulenta' 1st August 1772. Dedicated to his brother-in-law, the Rev. Wilford Huddleston of Whitehaven St. Nicholas. Author of *Symptoms, Nature and Causes and Cure of the Essera or Nettlerash* (Whitehaven, 1774).

AIREY, Thomas, M.D., Rheims. 1st February 1744. Father of Lancelot Airey. Died in Jamaica.

BROWNRIGG, William, M.D., Leiden. Thesis 'De Praxi Medica Ineunda' 18th January 1737. Dedicated to his Leiden teachers.

CROSTHWAITE, Henry, M.D., Leiden. Thesis 'De Rachitide' 22nd May 1789. Dedicated to Joseph Stamper, surgeon of Workington and William Allanby, M.D. Edinburgh.

DIXON, Richard, M.D., Leiden. Thesis 'De Phthisi Pulmonali' 11th December 1739.

HISLOP, John, M.D., Leiden. Thesis 'De Dentitione Infantum Difficili et Laboriosa'. Dedicated to his father Robert Heslopp, surgeon; Jabez Cary, M.D., chemist; and Oliver Horsman. M.D. 21st September, 1700.

SENHOUSE, Richard, M.D., unknown university, B.A. Oxford. Belonged to the Senhouse family of Netherhall, Maryport, Cumberland. Attended Leiden in 1717.
