




Since the first edition of this book was published there have been many changes in anaesthetic and surgical techniques, which in some cases enable patients to have their operation and be discharged on the same day, or the day after their surgery. Preassessment clinics have reduced the incidence of unfit patients presenting for surgery, and this brings fewer unexpected problems to the recovery room. Significant advances from research into pain mechanisms have allowed a better understanding of analgesics and more efficient pain control. Alongside these improvements though, other dangers have emerged, such as the increased risk of diseases like HIV or hepatitis being transmitted, and latex allergy. The third edition of this book has been heavily revised in order to take account of all these changes and medical advances, and provides an essential, practical source of reference.


