The Applied Probability Trust

The Applied Probability Trust is a non-profit making organisation established in 1963 by three Australian sponsors with the collaboration of the London Mathematical Society. Its object is the advancement of research and publication in probability and more generally mathematics.

The Journal of Applied Probability was launched by the Trust in 1964. With an international editorial board, it was one of the first journals in the world devoted entirely to papers in probability theory and its applications. Starting from a fairly modest two issues in its first year, with less than 400 pages, the Journal expanded rapidly to over 700 pages in 1969, when it was joined by a companion publication, Advances in Applied Probability. Like the Journal, Advances contains papers in applications of probability theory to the biological, physical, social and technological sciences; while the Journal is now reserved for short research papers and notes, the Advances is devoted to review papers, longer research papers, and the proceedings of conferences.

The Trust also publishes *Mathematical Spectrum*, a magazine for student mathematicians in schools, colleges and universities, as well as the general reader interested in mathematics.

The office of the Applied Probability Trust is located in the Department of Probability and Statistics, University of Sheffield, England.
