Authors of papers on Latin American regional topics are encouraged to submit their work to Latin American Antiquity. However, papers on Latin American archaeology may be accepted in American Antiquity if they address broad methodological, theoretical, or comparative issues. Authors submit manuscripts to the editor for consideration as ARTICLES, REPORTS, COMMENTS, or FORUM essays. REVIEWS, BOOK NOTES, and OBITUARIES are solicited by the respective associate editors. Information regarding CURRENT RESEARCH should be directed to the coordinator, or to the assistant editor for the appropriate region.

Authors should submit an original and four copies of their manuscripts, including all figures, tables, references, and notes. Detailed information on policy, style, and technical matters of manuscript preparation is given in the "Editorial Policy, Information for Authors, and Style Guide for *American Antiquity* and *Latin American Antiquity*," which appeared in the October 1992 issue (57[4]:749–770).

The editor reserves the right to evaluate manuscripts (with or without peer review) for appropriate subject matter, quality, length, and compliance with the style guide. Manuscripts may be returned to authors if they fail to meet expectations or conform to these guidelines. Manuscripts are evaluated by the editor in consultation with peer refeeres, or by the associate editors, as appropriate. The editor has the final responsibility for all decisions regarding manuscripts. The review process generally takes a minimum of two to four months. Authors will be notified as soon as a decision is reached to accept (outright or with revisions) or reject a manuscript.
