4-8 SEPTEMBER 1978

Lectures and Clinical Demonstations will be given of testing procedures used with all age groups together with interpretation of results. Consideration will also be given to the management of young deaf children and their parents, speech and language and problems of childhood. Particular emphasis will be placed on those disorders which are not especially amenable to surgical treatment.

The Lecturers will be drawn from the Department's own staff, together with a number of distinguished guest lecturers.

Each day the course members spend four hours in the dissection laboratory and four hours observing live colour telecasts of surgery which correlate with the dissection of the day. Evenings are devoted to lectures illustrated by slides and motion picture demonstrations. Video tapes in colour from the Institute's Otologic Seminar Library are available for study by course participants.

Twenty-four board certified or board eligible otolaryngolosits and residents will be accepted in each course.

THE International Commission on Biological Effects of Noise is pleased to announce the Third International Congress on Noise as a Public Health Problem: Biological and Behavioural Effects. The Congress is scheduled to be held during the week of 25–29 September, 1978, in Freiburg, Federal Republic of Germany (West Germany). The official language of the Congress is English; simultaneous German translations will be provided.

In addition to the invited and contributed papers on scientific research and applications, major discussions are planned on governmental and industrial needs and problems. Other discussions will be held on ways to develop procedures that will permit practical solutions both for governments and for industries.
