Subscriptions may be sent to the Scott Polar Research Institute, Cambridge CB2 1ER, England, or to any bookseller.

Contributions are invited on subjects of general or specialized polar interest, including accounts of field work. Intending authors are encouraged to write to the editor in the first instance. Authors of articles receive galley proofs for correction, but proofs of notes and reports of field work are not submitted unless they are especially requested. Authors of articles receive 25 reprints free, and additional copies may be had on order. Reprints of notes or other material are supplied only on request.

Place-names used in *Polar Record* are those authorized by the administrative authority of each area as recognized by the British Government. Names not yet so authorized are avoided, where possible, or placed in quotation marks. Russian names are transliterated by the system agreed in 1947 between the United States Board on Geographic Names and the Permanent Committee on Geographical Names for British Official Use (see *Polar Record*, Vol 6, No 44, 1952, p 546).
