Posthumous honour to Graham Fraser

Your readers may be interested to know that the College of Speech and Language Therapists has awarded a post-humous honour to Graham Fraser FRCS, Consultant Oto-laryngologist at University College London Hospitals.

Theo Read, Principal Speech and Language Therapist, recalls Graham Fraser as a man of vision and determination, recognizing the potential value of cochlear implants from an early stage. Having led a team which developed and proved the effectiveness of a single channel cochlear implant, he was keen that people should have access to a range of options and was working on the development of a British multichannel device at the time of his death.
