Space is devoted to articles, of which more than 25 are published each year, but the journal also contains a

book review section, which may include review articles and shorter notes as well as normal-length reviews.

Religious Studies (ISSN 0034-4125) is published four times a year in March, June, September and December. Four parts form a volume.
