NORMAN GAMBLE FUND AND RESEARCH PRIZE.

The Council of the Royal Society of Medicine has accepted, as a trust, the sum of one thousand pounds (£1,000) presented by Mr. Norman Gamble for the purpose of providing a prize of £50 every fourth year for the best original work in Otology carried out during the preceding four years, the balance of the fund to be used for the purpose of awarding grants in aid of research work in Otology. The prize is open to any British subject, whether lay or medical.


Copies of the regulations governing the awards can be obtained from the Secretary of the Royal Society of Medicine, I Wimpole Street, W.I.

Peroral Endoscopy Table

The head rest enables the operator himself to place the patient in the desired position for a variety of operations. All parts touched by the operator are sterilisable.

The apparatus is an elaboration of Haslinger's Bronchoscopic head rest, but its range of utility is extended to enable the patient to be supported with the shoulders beyond the end of the table for esophagoscopy, and to be kept in the correct attitude during operations performed in the sitting or semi-sitting position.
