

One of the most prestigious bird journals in the world, *Ibis* has been in existence since 1859. It publishes papers from both professionals and amateurs on all aspects of ornithology ranging from geographical distribution to bird behaviour, covering topics such as kin selection, altruism and breeding systems. Reviews of the ornithological literature have always been an important feature of the journal. Although it is published for



the British Ornithologists' Union it is by no means exclusively British, and less than half the papers deal with British birds.

In January 1989, the Journal of Biogeography grew in size and stature, after fifteen years in its well-known small format. This growth above all reflected the development of the subject itself, with the emergence of new, exciting, and controversial theories, and the increasing relevance of biogeographical questions to the world at large. The last two years have seen this importance recognised even further and even more urgently. There is thus a vital need for the speedy publishing of research ideas and research progress in the field.

In order to meet this need, the Journal of Biogeography is spawning a sister publication, which will be called Global Ecology and Biogeography Letters (GEBL). This will be a small format, fast-track publication marketed under the same subscription, and distributed with the main Journal.

The new Letters will fall into four sections. First, there will be a section called 'Ecological Soundings', in which ecologists and biogeographers can express their personal views about key environmental matters. This will be followed by 'Research Letters', which will comprise fast-track, short, scientific papers of

important work in progress or vital research results. The third section, to be called 'News Letters', will give up-to-date reports on conferences and developments in software, as well as other items of news and general interest. Finally, 'Library Letters' will review scientific books of particular relevance to global concerns, such as pollution, 'the greenhouse effect', global warming, acidification, and so on.

Global Ecology and Biogeography Letters is a sister publication of Journal of Biogeography and is only available with a subscription to the Journal. The journals will be published together on a bimonthly basis, and a 1991 subscription costs £185.00 (UK), US\$375.00 (USA & Canada) or £208.00 (overseas) including postage.
