For the last thirteen years Professor T. A. Birrell of Nijmegen has edited a Newsletter for Students of Recusant History, containing bibliographies, reports of work in progress, thesis abstracts, notes on migrations and accessions and other useful material. The economics of publishing are such that no. 9 (1970) will have to be the last issue of the Newsletter in its original form. Instead, to maintain a valuable service to recusant historians, some parts of the Newsletter material will be printed each year in the April issue of Recusant History. The editors would welcome views on which items are most important; in the meantime, this issue contains lists of theses in progress and completed, compiled by Dr Alan Davidson, and notes on migrations and accessions, by Miss Elizabeth Poyser.
