It has also established study groups, the first of which has published its findings in a book on 'Schooling in Contemporary European Society', other studies are in progress on Psychological Problems of Youth in a Changing Europe, Energy Forecasting, Higher Education, and Risk Assessment in Relation to Atmospheric Changes.

It can be seen that the Academia Europaea has a wide perspective and this is reflected in its new journal the *European Review*.
