## INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE.

WE are informed that the Industrial Hygiene Section of the International Labour Office, Geneva, proposes to publish from time to time a series of notes of a bibliographical character containing information regarding new publications dealing with questions of industrial hygiene. The notes will be universal in scope, and in order that they may be as complete as possible it is desired to include references not only to writings issued in book form but also to occasional articles, reprints of lectures, etc., published in medical or other periodicals. In return, the International Labour Office will be glad to supply its correspondents with the bibliographical notes as they are issued.
