and Israeli states were to become independent, from September 1, 1949, recommended by the U.N. Special Committee on Palestine, to October 1, 1948.

3. It was in 1973 that President Truman made his comment about comparing the pressure exerted on him regarding the Palestinian question and the dismissal of General MacArthur.
