51ST FRENCH CONGRESS OF OTO-RHINO-LARYNGOLOGY

The fifty-first French Congress of Oto-rhino-laryngology will be held in the Grand Amphitheatre of the Faculty of Medicine of Paris on October 22nd, 23rd, 24th and 25th, 1951, with Dr. M. Bouchet of Paris as President and Professor Léon Binet, Member of the Institute, as Honorary President. The two main subjects of discussion will be:

- (1) Surgical treatment of bilateral abductor paralysis of the larynx, by Drs. A. Moulonguet (Paris), R. Mayoux (Lyons), J. J. Debain and J. Bouche (Paris).
- (2) Nasal Allergy, by Drs. J. Bourdial, P. J. André and P. Clerc (Paris).

During the Congress operation sessions will take place in the mornings at the various oto-laryngological clinics of the hospitals in Paris, and the operation lists will be posted up on the morning of October 22nd in the Grand Amphitheatre. There will be an exhibition of instruments and oto-laryngological apparatus in the grand hall of the Faculty of Medicine.


