

GapKit 2.0 is a completely rewritten version of GapKit. GapKit 2.0 runs under Microsoft Windows 3.1 or higher and incorporates a range of new features, making it one of the most up-to-date and flexible programs of its type.



The teacher can

- copy and paste texts and clipart into GapKit from any application;
- create new texts using GapKit's powerful word-processing facilities;
- create gaps in any text simply by clicking and dragging the mouse;
- specify a range of up to 30 alternative answers for each gap;
- create multiple-choice exercises with specified or randomised distractors;
- specify if incorrect punctuation and letters typed in the wrong case should be penalised;
- include an optional 'hint line' for each gap;
- decide whether the hint line is to appear before or after the student attempts an answer;

- link a sound file with any gap;
- link a graphic image with any gap;
- resize the program window to accommodate any screen definition.

The student can

- attempt gaps in any order simply by pointing and clicking with the mouse;
- get help for any gap in the form of a 'hint line';
- call up an audio clue for any gap;
- call up a picture clue for any gap;
- enlarge the font of the text and of the multiple-choice window.

GapKit 2.0 also offers

- an 'intelligent' analysis and feedback routine which homes in on the answer that the student is aiming at and indicates which letters or parts of the answer the student has got right;
- a wide range of fonts in different sizes and various combinations of screen colours;
- a conversion program to convert exercises created with GapKit 1.0 and Wida Software's Gapmaster;
- extensive on-line help.

Notes for Contributors

ReCALL, the journal of CTI Modern Languages in association with EUROCALL, seeks to fulfil the stated aims of EUROCALL as a whole, which are to advance education by:

- (a) promoting the use of foreign languages within Europe;
- (b) providing a European focus for the promulgation of innovative research, development and practice in the area of computer-assisted language learning and technology enhanced language learning in education and training;
- (c) enhancing the quality, diffusion and cost-effectiveness of relevant language learning materials.

All submissions are refereed. They are accepted for consideration on the assumption that they have not been previously published and are not currently being submitted to any other journal.

Typical subjects for submissions include theoretical debate on language learning strategies and their influence on courseware design, practical applications at developmental stage, evaluative studies of courseware use in the teaching and learning process, assessment of the potential of technological advances in the delivery of language learning materials, exploitation of on-line information systems, and discussions of policy and strategy at institutional and discipline levels. Survey papers are welcome provided that they are timely, up-to-date and well-structured.

The language of *ReCALL* is normally English. However, papers in French or German will be considered.

Articles should meet the following requirements:

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- include text on disk (IBM or Macintosh), in plain ASCII format;
- illustrations must be in a commonly-used electronic format (e.g. .tif, .eps, .bmp) with accompanying hard copy;
- include the author's name, position, institutional address, phone, fax and email details where available.

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
