

Professor Maritain turns his attention to a subject which is widely discussed at the present time. He considers what is the nature of a philosophy of history and what are the possibilities of such a discipline. He asks why are historians so distrustful of it? What about the views of Hegel, Comte, Marx, Toynbee and others? He analyses and probes such problems as: what kind of stability, if any, is discernible in history?
