The reappearance of the *Bulletin* after an enforced rest period of ten years is a demonstration of the regenerative power of the International Institute.

On July 18, 1940, the Institute was closed by the Germans; the Director and staff were refused entry to the building and the collections; subsequently the whole staff was dismissed. During the five years following the liberation the reconstruction of the sacked building has been regular and progressive.
