This is a sequel and supplement to *The Oxford Annotated Bible* (R.S.V.). It is edited by Professor Metzger, one of the co-editors of that work, with contributions from Robert C. Dentan, Floyd V. Filson, Herbert G. May, Walter J. Harrelson, and Sherman E. Johnson. It provides for the student, clergyman, and general reader the text of the R.S.V. with up-to-date introduction and annotations to the Apocrypha in general (including questions of canonicity) and to particular books, with endpaper maps (prepared by the Cartographic Department of the Clarendon Press), chronological tables of Seleucid and Hasmonean rulers, and other helps, material which is nowhere else available in such convenient and authoritative form. 320 pages (O.U.P.
