



The Journal normally expects articles to be not longer than eight thousand words, inclusive of endnotes; this represents a maximum of 33–5 pages of published text and 40–5 pages of an average double-spaced A4 typescript. The Journal of Ecclesiastical History (ISSN 0022-0469) is published quarterly by Cambridge University Press in January, April, July and October. Four parts form a volume.
